The General Secretariat for Vocational Education, Training, Life Long Learning and Youth of the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs, the competent body for implementing the European Year of Youth 2022, included in its National Action Plan for the European Year of Youth 2022 a nationwide survey on "Recording Best Practices for the Municipalities that implement European Policies for young people residing in their area".

The Hellenic Agency for Local Development and Local Government (EETAA) was responsible for implementing the survey in collaboration with the Central Union of Municipalities (KEDE).

This joint initiative attempted to map best practices of the Municipalities of the country, documenting the extent to which the First Tier of Greek local Government transpose European Policies for supporting youth at a local community level.

It is also a reference as regards to Municipalities exercising public policy for youth at a local level Municipalities, which are the competent bodies for managing local affairs and the main experts about local specificities of young people living in their area of responsibility.

For the purposes of the survey a questionnaire was designed, which was addressed to the 332 Municipalities of Greece and was circulated in the period 13 May - 30 August 2022.

The questionnaire comprised of two sections. The first section pertained to the investigation of actions for Youth on a local level (both by the Municipality itself and by other local bodies) that could be considered best practices, while the second section investigated knowledge about European policies for youth and their possible connection and implementation at a local level.

Data analysis was performed by using the SPSS statistics software package.



Participation of Municipalities in the Survey

The nationwide Survey for "Recording the Best Practices of Municipalities that Implement European Policies for young people residing in their area" comprises an action of the National Action Plan for the European Year of Youth 2022. The General Secretariat for Vocational Education, Training, Life Long Learning and Youth of the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs assigned the implementation to the Hellenic Agency for Local Development and Local Government (EETAA). The Central Union of Municipalities (KEDE) supported its conduct, by writing to the Municipalities and urging them to respond.

96 Municipalities out of a total of 332 responded to the survey (29%). The Municipalities of the Regions of the Ionian Islands and Western Macedonia appear to have the highest participation rates (82% and 77% respectively), while when grouping the Municipalities by Category / Type of Municipality, there appears to be a balanced participation ranging from 23% to 35%, with the highest participation in Large Mainland Municipalities and the Municipalities which are Capitals of Regional Units (Prefectures), with 35%.

The findings are presented by section and by sub-section, as per the 11 questions put to the Municipalities and are supported by tables and figures, which set out all the answers.

The tables present the above findings: (a) the total number of participating Municipalities, (b) per category/typology of participating Municipalities and (c) per Region of the country



The first section of the survey pertained to investigating actions for Youth at a local level (both by Municipalities and by other local bodies), which could be considered best practices.

SUB-SECTION A. ORGANISATION AND OPERATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY

Findings (questions 1-3): ☐ 72% of the Municipalities participating in the survey mentioned that youth issues are included in their current operational planning. 83% of the Municipalities of Metropolitan Centres included youth issues in the current operational planning, which is the highest percentage per Municipality category / typology, while 81% was the corresponding percentage for Medium sized Mainland Municipalities. The lowest percentage, 69%, appears in the Small Island Municipalities that participated in the survey. ☐ In 72% of the Municipalities in which youth issues are included in their current operational planning, specific actions for Youth have been specified. □ 55% of the participating Municipalities have a Deputy Mayor or Representative or Councillor for the field of Youth. □ 31% of municipalities have a dedicated organizational unit / service, which deals with Youth issues and provides counselling support to youth, 63% of which promote European initiatives for Youth. ☐ In the last year 47% of the Municipalities possessing a dedicated organizational unit / service, which deals with Youth issues and provides counselling support to youth have performed actions which are considered best practices and pertain to Youth, while 36%


of them said that their corresponding service does not work.




Findings (questions 4 - 5)



SUB-SECTION C: BEST PRACTICES OF MUNICIPALITIES


Findings (questions 6 - 7)

39% of participating Municipalities stated that they have implemented an action in the last three years which is considered to be a best practice and pertains to Youth.
17% of the Municipalities of Metropolitan Centres that have participated in the survey have implemented actions that are considered best practices.
In total 83 actions were mentioned in the survey, out of which only 11 (13%) were funded by a European source of financing.
The number of actions per category - typology of Municipalities participating over the last three years is at least 2 for all categories, while 3 Large Mainland Municipalities and Municipalities that are Prefecture capitals had a higher number, namely 2.6 actions on average.
In terms of the scope of the action, a balanced result emerged: Sports (28%), Culture/Arts, Training/ Employment, Social Policy and Volunteering (27%), Public Policy (22%), etc.
As regards types of activity, Workshops have a clear lead with 27%, followed by: Public Debate (18%), Training & Guidance (17%), Festival (12%), etc.
11% of Municipalities participating in the research stated that it had participated in Global - European - National Networks that are active in the field of Youth.





SUB-SECTION D: BEST PRACTICES YOUTH ORGANISATIONS - LOCAL BODIES

Findings (questions 8 - 11)

☐ **Youth Organisations** operate in 35 of the Municipalities participating in the survey mainly in the fields of Volunteerism (83%), Culture / Arts (71%) and Sports (63%).

Youth organisations in 12 out of 35 participating Municipalities carried out in the last 3 years 20 actions which the Municipalities characterised as best practices, 5 of which were carried out with European funding.

The key fields of implementation for the above actions where Volunteering (55%), Culture/Arts (45%) and Sports (30%).


□ 24 Municipalities stated that Bodies in their region, although not operating chiefly in matters of Youth, have implemented 42 actions for Youth, which the Municipalities term best practices, 5 of which were carried out with European financing.

Key fields of implementation of the above actions were Volunteering (43%), Culture/Arts (38%), Health Promotion (33%) and Sports (31%).



In the context of the European Year of Youth 2022, the General Secretariat for Vocational Education, Training, Life Long Learning and Youth of the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs, appointed the Hellenic Agency for Local Development and Local Government (EETAA) in collaboration with the Central Union of Municipalities (KEDE), to be in charge of implementing a nationwide survey to "Record Best Practices for the Municipalities that implement European Policies for youth residing in their area".

To this end, EETAA designed an online questionnaire, which circulated from 13 May – 30 August 2022 throughout the 332 Municipalities of Greece.

This joint initiative attempts to constitute a reference document for when Municipalities exercise public policy for youth at a local level, given that they are the materially competent agencies for managing local affairs and the main experts concerning local specificities and the characteristics of youth living in their area of responsibility.

The applicable legislation¹ for the first tier of Local Government in Greece, i.e. Municipalities, in implementation of the requirement enshrined in the Constitution (article 102, par. 1)², includes areas of competence irrevocably and functionally linked to youth. At the same time, in 2006, youth representation at a local level³ was legislated with the creation of Youth Local Councils.

In a nationwide study on issues of institutional representation of youth at the local level, carried out by EETAA in 2022: (a) 7 active Municipal Youth Councils were identified throughout the Municipalities of the country (in the Municipalities of Kavala, Komotini and Paggaio in the Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace; the Municipalities of Volvi, Thessaloniki and Thermi in the Region of Central Macedonia; and the Municipality of Larissa in the Region of Thessaly); (b) it was found that the importance of Local Youth Councils has diminished; (c) the interest of a great number of Municipalities to convene Municipal Youth Councils was ascertained; (d) the need to establish the related legislative framework was stressed.

Against this backdrop, the Survey to "Record Best Practices in Municipalities that implement European Policies for youth living in their area" highlighted the following findings:

96 Municipalities (29%) of the 332 responded. The Municipalities of the Regions of the Ionian Islands and Western Macedonia appear to have the highest participation rates (82% and 77% respectively), while when grouping the Municipalities by Category / Type of Municipality, there appears to be a balanced participation ranging from 23% to 35%, with the highest participation in Large Mainland Municipalities and the Municipalities which are Capitals of Regional Units (Prefectures), with 35%.

The Municipalities have included youth issues at a satisfactory level in their operational planning (72%), which applies more for the Municipalities of City Centres and Small Mainland Municipalities (83% and 81% of those participating in the study) and to a lesser degree for Small Island Municipalities (50% of those participating in the study).

Furthermore, as regards these particular Municipalities, 75% had proceeded to specify the actions related to Youth issues, in order to ensure strategy implementation in this field. Large and Medium-sized Island Municipalities appear to be delayed in this, as only 50% of participants in the said category had already specified the actions for Youth.

② At the internal organizational level, the relevant organizational arrangements have been made, as approximately half of the Municipalities participating have a Deputy Mayor or Representative or Councillor for the field of Youth (55%) with the small Island Municipalities displaying a smaller percentage (25%), which can be justified in part by the characteristics, capabilities and priorities of these specific Municipalities.

Additionally, one in three Municipalities has a dedicated organizational unit / service, which deals with Youth issues and provides counselling support to youth (31%) and European initiatives for Youth are promoted in two out of three of these dedicated organizational units / services (63%).

What stands out is that none of the 13 Small Mainland and Small Mountainous Municipalities participating in the study has such a corresponding unit.

It is noteworthy, however, that the existence or lack of a dedicated unit / service does not appear to activate actions / good practices to any greater extent.

As far as the existence and operation of Local and Municipal Youth Councils goes, conditions appear quite problematic, as only one in ten Municipalities has an active Youth Council, whether Local or Municipal (10%), with the overwhelming majority of Municipalities either not having proceeded with creating them or where already existing Councils have been rendered inactive. It is typical that the Municipal Youth Councils, which are active, have been established only by the Municipalities of Large Cities and the Large Mainland Municipalities and Municipalities of capitals of Regional Units.

Overall, country-wide the percentage of Municipalities stating that they have implemented some action(-s) over the past three years, which is considered to be best practice on Youth issues is relatively high (39%), with the leading ones being mainly Large Mainland Municipalities and Municipalities of capitals of Regional Units (Prefectures) – 38% of participating Municipalities from this particular category.



② A large number of actions is recorded by the total number of participating Municipalities (83) with an average of two (2) actions per category / type of Municipalities with the Large Mainland Municipalities and the Municipalities of capitals of Regional Units (Prefectures) yet again leading the way, as they display the largest number of actions, with an average of 2.6 actions.

These actions appear to cover almost all the fields of implementation in a balanced manner (Sports, Culture / Arts, Training / Occupation, Social Policy and Volunteering, Public Policy, etc.), while the preferred type of activity appears to be Workshops.

The development of collaboration / synergies at a local level and volunteering appear to constitute components of the actions that are being implemented.

In general, the existence and operation of Regional and Municipal Youth Councils and Youth Organisations appear to be problematic, which is confirmed by the fact that agencies which are not particularly active in Youth issues have implemented far more relevant actions than Youth Organisations.

Youth Organisations are more active in the fields of Volunteering (83% of Organisations); Culture and Arts (71%); and Sports (63%) and most of their actions concern these sectors.

Those agencies that are not mainly active in Youth issues, besides actions related to the above sectors, chiefly implement actions related to Promoting Health.

Actions for Youth are implemented by collective bodies / partnerships between agencies.

The European dimension / connection and action outlook appears weak, which is reflected in two basic components: on the one hand the exceptionally low percentage of funding for the actions / best practices from European funding sources available (13%) and, on the other hand, the equally low participation of Municipalities in European networks for Youth (10%).

The percentage of actions funded by European sources is equally low, both in Youth Organisations (25%) and in agencies that are not active mainly in Youth issues (14%).

ln addition to the above, there is limited knowledge of "official" specialised European policies for Youth, as depicted in official documents of the European Union, and poor connection of everyday practice to significant European sources of information, such as the European Youth Portal, the European Youth Forum, as well as participation, both theoretical and practical, in European Initiatives for Youth with the exception of the Erasmus + - Youth. The Source Erasmus + - Youth is, in general, considered to have the greatest uptake by Local Government for implementing European and national policies for Youth, followed by Next Generation EU.



On the contrary, additional information appears to exist as regards the National Policy for Youth, as this is depicted in official documents (see the Strategic Plan for Vocational Education, Training, Lifelong learning and Youth, 2022-2024).

Even though (as we have noted herein above) knowledge / use of European initiatives appears reduced, the majority of those asked were positive about the potential degree of implementation of all the individual goals set by the European Strategy for Youth at a local level (Connecting the EU with Youth, Equality of All Genders, Quality Employment and Quality Learning, Mental Health and Wellbeing, etc.), as it is considered that all goals may be implemented "to quite a large and even large extent" on a local level. Additionally, 72% consider that their actions achieve one or more of these goals.

In conclusion, therefore, to the degree we are able to, and always with the reservations stemming from the limitations of a study in all its stages (methodology followed, data collection, result analysis and interpretation), we can observe that Municipalities have incorporated Youth issues organizationally in their operational planning, implement actions — best practices for Youth to a significant extent, are more familiar with national policy, are aware of and make use of European initiatives with extensive long-term presence and increased visibility, such as Erasmus +, while at the same time we can record significant lack of awareness of more recent initiatives / funding formats.

Special mention must be made to the institutional representation of youth at a local level, despite it appearing problematic within the framework of the study as regards the operation of Local / Municipal Youth Councils, there is a growing interest by Municipalities to convene Municipal Youth Councils and the need to establish a relevant legislative framework (EETAA 2022 study) has been expressed which is indicative of Greek Youth's active citizenship.
